


STRENGTHENING KANSAS COMMUNITIES

1 in 5 Kansans served by 11 Y Associations in 27 communities

The Y provides a supportive environment for families of all backgrounds, ages, and abilities where people can meet their health and wellbeing goals through exercise, nutrition, and chronic disease management and prevention programs.

VOLUNTEERISM



6,774 volunteers donated 328,215 hours

The Y is the charity of choice for thousands of Kansans who donated \$16.2 million to 11 Associations in 2019. These volunteers gave \$7.7 million worth of their time, talent and effort to support neighbors and improve Kansas communities.

BUILDING CAREERS



4,092 Kansans employed

The Y employs neighbors to help neighbors. The state's YMCAs employ thousands of full time, part time and seasonal staff, and we are one of the largest employers of youth staff. This large and diverse workforce is an economic engine in our state.

SENIOR WELL-BEING



50,056 Kansas seniors connected

Kansas Y programs ensure older Kansas adults have every opportunity to connect with one another and engage in meaningful activities. The Y knows that making small lifestyle changes that include increasing physical activity, eating healthier and staying active socially can help older adults live better.

FIGHTING HUNGER



10,223 kids nourished

The Y's year-round food programs stand out in the fight against child hunger by not only providing 300,000 healthy meals and snacks in 2019, but by teaching children how to make healthy choices, stay focused and enjoy physical activity.

TOGETHERHOOD



561,495 Kansans impacted

1 in 4 Kansas kids and 1 in 5 adults participated in Y programs, membership and services in 2019. The Y is building community by bringing people of all ages and walks of life together to identify goals, encourage teamwork, and connect to others.

MEETING COMMUNITY NEEDS



\$10,000,000 in financial assistance

Thanks to \$16.2 million in generous philanthropic gifts given to the Y this year, Kansas Ys provided \$10 million in financial assistance and subsidies to Kansas families. This aid allowed individuals, children and families to participate in Y programs and services that enhanced their health and wellbeing, and our child care subsidies allow families to go to work knowing their kids are safe and receiving quality care. Kansas Ys also provided \$2.1 million in services through public grants and contracts.

NURTURING YOUTH



161,334 Kansas kids served

The Y provides youth with the tools and resources they need to succeed in life. This year 11,420 kids and teens explored new interests, learned new skills and built relationships at 33 summer day and overnight camps. 3,475 children prepared for kindergarten in 21 early learning programs. 15,944 youth discovered support and friendship in 101 before and after school programs. 14,448 youth learned lifesaving swim skills, and 26,143 kids learned teamwork and stayed active in sports.
